My Te Reo Goals Junior School Year 1-2



By the end of year two I will be able to...

- Name and identify ten <u>colours</u> in Māori
- Say <u>numbers</u> 1-10 in Māori (extension forwards and backwards) (<u>Nga tau - numbers</u>)
- Can introduce myself in Māori through a simple pepeha, including the names for each member of their <u>whānau</u> (family) i.e māmā = mother, pāpā = father
- Name and identify up to 8 <u>classroom objects (eg tepu-table)</u> <u>(poster example)</u>
- Show the action for up to 8 'doing words' i.e hikoi = walk
- Know a variety of up to four <u>greetings</u> including farewells
 i.e Kia ora, tēnā koe, mōrena, ata mārie, ka kite, ka kite
 anō
- Can say and use 2-3 <u>positive adjectives</u> eg tino pai (very good), ka rawe (excellent), tumeke (choice)
- Know a variety of Māori <u>waiata</u>, including the national anthem



My Te Reo Goals Middle School Year 3-4



By the end of year four I will be able to...

- Say <u>numbers</u> 1-20 in Māori (extension forwards and backwards) (<u>Nga tau - numbers</u>)
- Can introduce myself in Māori through a simple pepeha, including some landmarks.
- Can describe general <u>weather</u> (huarere) conditions in Māori (e.g sunny/rā paki, raining/ua, fog/kohu, cloudy/kapua) and name <u>seasons</u>.
- Can answer the question <u>Kei te pehea koe?</u>/how are you?' in 5 different <u>ways</u> (eg I am happy/koa, sad/pōuri, sleepy/hiamoe)
- Know and follow a variety up to 8 <u>simple</u> classroom commands
- Name and identify 8 parts of the body in Māori
- Use the <u>poi</u> with a simple action <u>sona</u> (E rere taku poi).



My Te Reo Goals Senior School Year 5-6



By the end of year six I will be able to...

- Say <u>numbers</u> 1-50 in Māori (extension forwards and backwards) (<u>Nga tau - numbers</u>)
- Can introduce myself in Māori through a pepeha, including a greeting at the beginning and landmarks.
- Name and identify a variety of up to 6 modes of <u>transport</u>
- Can give simple <u>directions</u>, eg walk forward/back, jump left/right (create a map/coding or guide a friend)
- Understand and talk about <u>Matariki</u> (Māori New Year) and its customs and traditions
- Can name 6 leisure <u>activities</u> and can design a poster for one using a variety of Māori language.
- Can play simple Reo games eg Twister (using Māori language for colours and hand/ringa and foot/waewae) and Matau-Maui (left and right rakau/stick game)
- Use the ti rakau (small sticks) with a simple action song <u>E</u> <u>Papa Waiari</u>.



My Te Reo Goals Intermediate School Year 7-8



By the end of year eight I will be able to...

- Say <u>numbers</u> 1-100 in Māori (extension forwards and backwards) (<u>Nga tau - numbers</u>)
- Can introduce myself in Māori through a pepeha, including a greeting at the beginning, landmarks and a formal ending.
- Name and identify up to 10 items of food including <u>fruit</u> and <u>vegetables</u> and can write a shopping list or menu for a hui (meeting/gathering).
- Can invent a simple Reo game using my knowledge of Te Reo (board game/physical game/digital game) and can teach my game to a group of younger students in my buddy class (tuakana teina).
- Know and can name up to 5 Atua/Guardians and their connection (eg Tane Mahuta-Guardian of the Forest, Tawhirimatea-Guardian of the Wind)
- Know the names of up to 4 Māori carving symbols and their meanings.
- Name and label 6 parts of a whare (house) in Māori (<u>Toku kainga/My house</u>) (<u>poster example</u>)
