

The Treaty of Waitangi happened because the British came over to New Zealand and tried to take Maorilland. They made a treaty and wrote it in English, which the Maori didn't understand. They held guns over the Maori and made them sign it. Some of the Maori accidentally disobeyed the treaty because they didn't even know what it said, and they lost their lives and homes. It was on the 6th of February 1840 when they signed the treaty. Eventually, the British took over the land and built modern style houses on it.
